I Corinthians 15 (Sermon Series 1 of 6)

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LIFE GROUP MINISTRIES

Read I Corinthians 15-58

Find and discuss the most significant repeated words and why they are used.
(ie, resurrection, Scripture, transformed, etc.)

Review the sermon notes

Explore some Old Testament references to resurrection:
Daniel 12:2, Psalms 16:10f, 49:14, Isaiah 26:19

Explore some New Testament references to resurrection:
Matthew 22:31, Luke 20:36, Mark 12:25,
John 5:29, 6:39-40, 44, 54, 11:25, Philippians 3:10

Discuss how your lives were changed when you came to Christ.

As believers, do we have any human fears about death?

Paul reminds the Corinthians of the gospel he preached to them in verses 1-11.
What are the essentials of the gospel?

What importance does the resurrection of Christ play in Paul's preaching of the good news of Jesus Christ?

In verses 12-19 Paul hypothesises if there is no resurrection. If this were true, discuss the consequences for Christ, for Paul and for us.

Some translations use the terms “fallen asleep” in vv 18, 20. Discuss why this may be a good way to describe the dead in Christ.

How will Christ's resurrection overcome the effects of Adam's sin? (Vs 21-28)?

What is one area in your life where you need to experience more victory in Christ?

Discuss how our belief or disbelief in the resurrection affects a person's lifestyle?

How can our lifestyle affect our witness to a world focused on “eating and drinking”?

In verses 35-41 Paul illustrates several ways to explain why the resurrection is not illogical but makes good sense. What are his illustrations?

Although the resurrection body is somehow related to the natural body, how is it also radically different? (Vs 42-39)

What are you most looking forward to in your heavenly existence with Christ?

What hope is there in verses 50-58 for us when we grow weary of this physical world and long to escape to heaven?

How do you feel the physical resurrection of Christ does, does not or should affect the Christ's church today?

Name one or two things from this scripture and sermon that have substantially affected you personally?
